From the oldest house in Connecticut, the Henry Whitfield House in Guilford (1639), to a modern house by Philip Johnson, the Glass House in New Canaan (1949), the architectural resources of the state have been protected and maintained by a group of individuals and organizations as diverse as the structures they have saved. The Historic Preservation and Museum Division of the Connecticut Commission on Culture & Tourism will present an exhibition on the history of the preservation movement in Connecticut focusing on historic houses.
