## IMPLEMENTING EFFECTIVE ON-SCENE REHABILITATION

Presented by: Denise L. Smith, Ph.D. and Craig A. Haigh, CFO, NREMT-P

**Course Description:** Dr. Smith and Chief Haigh will provide research data documenting the physical and physiologic stresses of firefighting. They will review current recommendations for on-scene rehabilitation, including procedures for medical monitoring, used to minimize the detrimental effects of heat stress. They will also examine strategies for forming outside partnerships and collaborations enabling fire departments to implement effective rehabilitation programs to meet firefighters' needs while recognizing that most departments have limited human and financial resources.

The program is designed for chiefs, instructors, incident commanders, company officers, firefighters, and EMS providers including system medical directors, Emergency Medical Technicians at all levels, EMS managers and personnel who operate or respond to emergency incidents to provide rehab services or operate canteens.

**Instructor Bios:** Denise L. Smith is Professor and Chair of Exercise Science at Skidmore College in Saratoga Springs, NY, and a Research Scientist at the University of Illinois Fire Service Institute. Dr. Smith is the author of the textbook, Exercise Physiology: For Health Fitness and Performance. She earned her Ph.D. in Kinesiology with a specialization in Exercise Physiology from the University of Illinois at Urbana-Champaign in 1990. Dr. Smith's research is focused on the physiological effects of firefighting, particularly the cardiovascular strain associated with the combination of heavy physical work, heat stress, and the psychological stress that firefighters routinely encounter. Dr. Smith has collaborated with several major Fire Service organizations, including the United States Fire Administration, the National Volunteer Fire Council, the National Institute of Occupational Safety Firefighters Fatality Investigation Program and the National Fallen Firefighters Foundation.

Craig A. Haigh, a 23-year veteran of the fire service, is Chief of the Hanover Park (IL) Fire Department and a Field Staff Instructor with the University of Illinois Fire Service Institute. Chief Haigh is a Nationally Registered Paramedic and has a Bachelor of Science Degree in Fire and Safety Engineering Technology. He is an accredited Chief Fire Officer and is in the third year of the National Fire Academy's Executive Fire Officer Program. Chief Haigh has presented at numerous state and local conferences and trainings, and he has authored several fire service training and management articles.
