The Connecticut Fire Academy, in cooperation with the National Fire Academy, present three courses through the National Fire Academy's off campus deliveries program.

Shaping the Future

March 17 - 18, 2016

Course # 16284

Fire Marshal Credit: 15

This is two day course is designed to assist first and second level supervisors and Company Officers (COs) in developing knowledge and skills in contemporary approaches to organizational problem-solving. Topics include use of creative approaches to identifying trends within their organizations; applying problem solving methodologies; the importance and application of continuous improvement within organizations; how to quantify problems and solutions; factors in organizational and individual resistance to change; and strategies for implementing change. The course incorporates a facilitated learner centered methodologies including lecture, small and large group activities, and individual assessments.

This class is designed for first and second level supervisors and Company Officers (COs) who are upwardly mobile within their organizations. Course is also appropriate for administrative officers who are responsible for significant staff functions within the organization and who report directly to top management.

Leadership I for Fire and EMS: Strategies for Company Success

Fire Marshal Credit: 12

This is two day course presents the company officer with the basic leadership skills and tools needed to perform effectively in the fire service environment. The course includes techniques and approaches to problem-solving, ways to identify and assess the needs of the company officer's subordinates, methods for running meetings effectively in the fire service environment, and decision making skills for the company officer.

This class is designed for line fire officers, unit commanders, or program supervisors. Appropriate for fire or rescue personnel due for promotion/appointment to officer rank or supervisory position within six months. Course incorporates skills required for Training officers, staff, or administrative officers of fire and rescue organizations.

Building Organizational Support for Community Risk Reduction

September 15 - 16, 2016

Course # 17023

Fire Marshal Credit: 14

This is two day course is designed to help fire and emergency services learn what community risk reduction is and how to build organizational support for it. This course will address the challenges fire departments face in shifting their priorities from response to prevention. In many departments community risk reduction is still considered a low priority. This course will show you how community risk reduction can help you and your department becomes more of a community player in times of decreased budgets.

The course includes three units of instruction:

Unit One: Components of Community Risk Reduction

Unit Two: Community Risk Reduction as a Service Priority

Unit Three: Building Organizational Support for Community Risk Reduction

There is a pre-course assignment to complete before class that should take about 1 hour to complete.

The target audience for this course includes but not limited to, fire and emergency services personnel who want to learn about community risk reduction and staff who are currently involved with fire prevention and have an interest in advancing risk reduction efforts in their community.

Class Hours: 16

Course Fee: \$60.00

Students attending any or all of these classes will receive a Connecticut Fire Academy and a National Fire Academy certificate for each completed class.
