16 Alternatives to Death by PowerPoint

Howard Cross has spent a significant portion of his professional career, more than twenty-five years, working with individuals and groups in both private and public sectors, in developing their abilities as effective trainers/facilitators. Effective is the operative word here: it is not enough to merely present information; one must make the information alive. For this to happen the following conditions should be met; adults must want to learn, adults learn best when they see a practical application, adults learn by doing; adults learn by solving realistic problems, experience affects adult learning, adults respond to a variety of teaching methods.

Don't let PowerPoint keep this from happening!

The overall goal of this workshop is to teach the participants a number of alternatives to PowerPoint as a vehicle for student acquisition of skills, knowledge, and concepts. As a result of these workshops participants will have increased confidence regarding their facilitation/training skills, and a better understanding of how to present material in a quick-learning format.

This workshop will employ a variety of delivery approaches including small and large group discussion, simulations, discovery activities, problem analysis and solving, individual and small group presentations, individual and small group feedback.

Howard Cross - Howard has been in training and development for more than twenty-five years during which time he has worked with numerous clients that include several Fortune 500 Companies, non-profit groups, fire and emergency response organizations and state and federal agencies. Since 1987 he has been a highly sought after instructor at the National Fire Academy in Maryland where he teaches Executive Fire Officer and Interpersonal Dynamics Programs.
