I-300: 24 hours of instruction consisting of 5 modules. Students will interact in more detail on the organization and operations of ICS. There will be a comprehensive description of responsibilities of the organizational elements within each section of the ICS. Discussions on ways in which incidents are organized to ensure achievement of incident objectives utilizing briefings and forms used to support the incident. The importance of staging, resource management, ordering responsibilities, Operational Planning Worksheets, development of incident objectives, strategies and planning meetings will be explored. Class discussion on support plans for incidents, e.g. communications, traffic, medical and demobilization.
