The Commission on Fire Prevention and Control in cooperation with the Submarine Base Fire Department, the Department of Environmental Protection Division of Forestry and the Connecticut Fire Chiefs Association Statewide Fire Rescue Disaster Response Plan are pleased to offer Incident Command System (ICS) training to Connecticut's Emergency Response Community (fire, law enforcement, EMS, Emergency Management). The training offered is two highly regarded National Wildfire Coordination Group (NWCG) Incident Command System courses. These ICS programs are recognized for compliance under the new National Incident Management System (NIMS). There is **no** charge to attend these programs.

**I-300 ICS Intermediate**  
**January 30-31, & February 1, 2006 9:00 a.m. – 4:00 p.m.**  
**SHEPHERD OF THE SEA CHAPEL – Groton, CT**

**I-300:** 24 hours of instruction consisting of 5 modules. Students will interact in more detail on the organization and operations of ICS. There will be a comprehensive description of responsibilities of the organizational elements within each section of the ICS. Discussions on ways in which incidents are organized to ensure achievement of incident objectives utilizing briefings and forms used to support the incident. The importance of staging, resource management, ordering responsibilities, Operational Planning Worksheets, development of incident objectives, strategies and planning meetings will be explored. Class discussion on support plans for incidents, e.g. communications, traffic, medical and demobilization. Prerequisite is I-100 and I-200 or equivalent, please provide documentation with your registration.

**I-400 ICS Advanced**  
**February 13-15, 2006 9:00 a.m. – 4:00 p.m.**  
**SHEPHERD OF THE SEA CHAPEL – Groton, CT**

**I-400:** The I-400 (ICS Advanced) is a classroom delivered program that discusses advanced management applications of the Incident Command System including Command and General Staff, Unified Command, Major Incident Management, Area Command, and Multi-agency Coordination. Candidates for this course should have a considerable background in incident management in both academic and practical application. Prerequisite is I-300 or equivalent, please provide prerequisite documentation with your registration.

**Direction to Shepherd of the Sea Chapel (Groton, CT):**

**From I-95 North or South** take exit 86 and follow signs to Rt. 12 North. Follow Rt. 12 North approximately 4/10ths of a Mile, take right onto Gungywamp Rd. (Across from Submarine Base Station 2). Chapel on right side of road - 231 Gungywamp Rd.

**From I-395** take exit 79A, Mohegan Pequot Bridge, to Rt. 12 South, take right go to 9<sup>th</sup> traffic light turn left on to Gungywamp Rd. Go past first traffic light Chapel on right.
