

Paul Hashagen provides a photo-packed, written history into Rescue Company 1, New York City Fire Department with his new publication *One Hundred Years of Valor*. This hardbound book tells the story of the Rescue Company 1, which was organized in 1915. These firefighters handled explosives, dangerous chemicals, and controlled toxic leaks. They were sent to the most dangerous fires: in cellars, subs-cellars and in the holds of ships. In this fascinating publication, you will see photos that span 100 years, where these brave firefighters dangle from ropes or dive underwater to rescue those in peril. Heroically they pull civilians and firefighters from blazing or collapsed buildings, extricate people stuck in machines and pinned in vehicles.

Paul has written several non-fiction books including: "The Bravest" The official history of the New York City Fire Department published in 2000. "A Distant Fire" A History of FDNY Heroes was published in 1995 by dmc Fire Books in hardcover, then re-released in 2010 as a soft cover. Paul has also contributed to other notable books including "WTC-In Their Own Words" published by Firehouse Magazine 2011 and "Firefighters" By The National Fallen Firefighters Foundation.
