



DANIEL F. CARUSO, ESQ.
CHAIRMAN OF THE CONNECTICUT SITING COUNCIL.

Daniel F. Caruso is Chairman of the Connecticut Siting Council, an executive branch agency in Connecticut State Government, appointed by Governor M. Jodi Rell.

The Chairman also serves as the judge of probate for the Fairfield Probate District, having held that post since January of 1995. He is an active member of the Connecticut Probate Assembly, serving as its First Vice-President and a member of its Executive Committee.



Judge Caruso served the people of the Towns of Fairfield and Trumbull in the Connecticut House of Representatives from 1988 to 1994 and was Assistant Minority Leader from 1991 to 1994. During that time he was also a member of the environment, judiciary, general law, and regulations review committees.

Judge Caruso has also served the Town of Fairfield as a past member of the Board of Finance and the Representative Town Meeting, and as the town's treasurer. Civic groups that have counted him among their members include the Kiwanis Club, the Red Cross, Caroline House, which helps mothers and their children to learn English, and the Community Theatre Foundation, which preserves and operates the town's movie house.

The Siting Council's charge, by statute, is to objectively balance the statewide public need for adequate and reliable services at the lowest reasonable cost to consumers with the need to protect the environment and ecology of the state. Electric generation and transmission, natural gas, and specific forms of telecommunications infrastructure are under the exclusive jurisdiction of the Siting Council.

Judge Caruso is a graduate of the University of Connecticut and Vermont Law School.
