

2. In the May 2005 ISO-New England Seasonal Claimed Capability Report, BE is reported to have a summer rating of 451.22 MW and a winter rating of 530.46 MW (rounded to two decimal places). Does BE agree with these numbers?
3. Does BE's generating facility has black start capability?
4. Describe recent market trends and the relationship between the natural gas industry and electric generation.
5. Was BE affected by natural gas delivery during this past winter? Explain.
