CEAB Question No. 24

Please indicate which of your Company's existing facilities cleared in the first FCM auction.

Response

A listing of all resources that cleared the first auction is publicly available on the ISO-NE website at www.iso-ne.com/regulatory/ferc/filings/2008/mar/er08-633-000_03-03-08_fca_results_filing_capacity_supply_obligations.pdf. The Dominion facilities that cleared the auction include Millstone Power Station in Connecticut.

CEAB Question No. 25

Please provide your Company's estimate for planning processes of the on-going annual revenue level required for continued operation of each facility. Please indicate whether your Company believes the ISO-NE's Forward Capacity Market auctions will provide sufficient capacity revenues.

Response

Dominion does not publicly release information about annual revenue requirements with regard to its merchant facilities. In terms of the Forward Capacity Market going forward, Dominion hopes that the market will provide sufficient revenues to support investment in new generating resources, but it is still too early to tell whether the market has been designed properly. Certainly, if the auction clearing prices continue to be pushed well below the cost of new entry when new generation is actually needed by the region, it is unlikely to provide sufficient revenues to attract developers and investors.

CEAB Question No. 26

Please indicate for each of your existing facilities assuming that there will be no RMR agreements after 2009:

- a. The anticipated retirement date, if applicable, in the 2008-2017 time period;
- b. The impact(s) of increased emission control, specifically reducing by 20% and then a total of 50% of the allowable NOx emissions on a BTU basis, on equipment investment and economic retirement decisions.

Response

- a. Dominion currently has no plans to retire any existing Connecticut facilities during this timeframe. Additionally we have no generation units in New England that have full "Reliability Must-Run" status.
- b. Millstone Units 2 and 3 are nuclear powered operating units and thus emit no greenhouse gases. Millstone does however have a series of diesel-powered emergency back up generators. These units only operate for site-specific backup

generation to maintain our internal systems and are not designed/licensed to provide power to the New England electricity grid.

Please indicate which of your planned generating units or expansions of existing units cleared in the first FCM auction? Provide the amount (in MW) that cleared for each facility.

Response

The 80 MW uprate planned at Millstone Unit 3 cleared the first FCM auction.

Response

Dominion did not submit any show of interest forms for the second FCM auction.
