Re: **PETITION NO. 922** – UIL Distributed Resources, LLC Declaratory Ruling that no Certificate of Environmental Compatibility and Public Need is Required for the Installation of a Fuel Cell Generating Facility Located at 1835 Hebron Avenue, Glastonbury, Connecticut – **Revised Landscaping Plan.**

Dear Chairman Stein:

In response to your October 6, 2015 letter addressed to several elected officials concerning the above referenced Petition, UIL Distributed Resources, LLC (“UDR” or “the Company”) met with a number of stakeholders to discuss the project generally as well as the landscaping plan that the Connecticut Siting Council (“Council”) approved on September 8, 2015.

UDR understands and appreciates the Council’s intent to ensure that an effective landscaping plan form part of the project. With those underpinnings in mind (and as a response to the October 6 letter), the Company submits this revised plan (“Plan”) to the Council.

The Plan represents the end result of a cooperative effort with the Town of Glastonbury. Factors considered include sight lines, topography, deer resistance, sun exposure, visual impact, and the locations of above and below grade utilities. The Plan provides for a more immediate screening of the facilities (especially to the north side of the fuel cell) that is accomplished through the addition of several large plant varieties. Please *see* Attachment A for a detailed drawing.

UDR respectfully asks that the Council find this revised Plan acceptable.
