Dear Ms. Mayo:

According to the Connecticut Department of Environmental Protection's (CTDEP) "Instructions for Completing a Connecticut Natural Diversity Data Base Review Request Form" dated March 2, 2007 there is no conflict "if the project is not (1) within a shaded area; or (2) overlapping a water body that has any shading; or (3) upstream or downstream (by less than 1/2 mile) from a shaded area the project will not impact any known occurrence of listed species or significant natural community... You do not need to complete and submit the CT NDDB Review Request Form (DEP-APP-007)."

Based on EBI's desktop review of information currently available online at (www.ct.gov/dep/endangeredspecies), the above referenced project is not located within a shaded area (NDDB Polygon); or overlapping a water body that has any shading; or upstream or downstream (by less than 1/2 mile) from a shaded area. 
