Dear Ms. Bachman:

Thank you for passing along the recent SBA Towers IV, LLC filing regarding efforts to conceal the antennas at the 160 West Street tower site. I shared this information with Celco's network radio frequency (RF) engineers. To the best of their knowledge, no one from SBA has reached out to anyone in the New England West Network RF Department so this was the first time they had heard about the proposed concealment solution.

Please understand that my client is eager to work with the Siting Council and SBA to address the antenna concealment concerns at this site. We do, however, have some concerns with the recommended approach, primarily because it is not something that my client has ever dealt with before. Obviously, the biggest concern relates to whether the concealment approach suggested will impact system performance. If it does, then alternative concealment measures will have to be explored.


That said, Verizon Wireless does not object to SBA's proposed antenna concealment option but would ask that the Council condition any endorsement on SBA's commitment to work
