


Greetings, Nicole:

Site examination by a NITHPO representative of the proposed cell tower location designated TCNS #21258 located in Haddam, CT has revealed evidence of a ceremonial stone landscape that is of significance to the Narragansett Indian Tribe.

**However, neither the tower footprint nor the access road, as positioned at the time of the walkover, threatens this ceremonial landscape. Our Office should be notified if changes are proposed for the planned positioning of the access road or tower. Such changes would require further examination to determine the hazard of impacts to this ceremonial stone landscape.**

On behalf of the Narragansett Indian Tribe, the NITHPO considers this project in compliance with and cleared of the Narragansett Tribe's Section 106 concerns.

If, however, during your construction excavation artifacts, features or human remains or other significant tribal cultural resources are encountered, please halt excavation and contact our Office and the State Historic Preservation Office for evaluation.

Thank you for your support of the FCC's government-to-government consultation with the Narragansett Indian Tribe under Section 106 of the National Historic Preservation Act.
