



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### PRE-HEARING INTERROGATORIES PETITION NO. 794 – BOZRAH CLEARVIEW RENEWABLE ENERGY LLC DECEMBER 6, 2006

1. How many residential structures are within 1,000 feet of the site? What is the distance and direction to the nearest residence?
2. Provide the property owner and land use for all abutting parcels, if known.
3. Provide a list of wood biomass providers that intend to provide fuel to CRE. Include the type and quantity of fuel to be provided. Have any Memorandums of Understanding or Letters of Intent been executed for this project?
4. What is the lifespan of the filter fabric system? How is the filter fabric replaced? Would replacement of the filter fabric require shutdown of plant operations? Is the disposed filter fabric treated as general waste?
5. What is the distance to the Franklin town line from the site parcel?
6. What is the size of the proposed propane storage tank?
7. Are the quantities of biomass presented in Table 2.4-1 correct? Page 3-14 lists a different wood biomass number and the tpd and tpy wood biomass quantities within the table do not correspond.
8. Provide an estimate of the number of towers, heights of towers, and amount of clearing required for each of the three interconnection options presented in Section 2.6.
9. Provide 8 ½ x 11 copies of the following:
  - a) the interconnection option diagrams presented on pages 2.6-2 and 2.6-3;
  - b) the Conceptual Process Flow Diagram presented on page 2.7-1;
  - c) Figure 3-5.
10. Provide an 11x17 copy of Figure 3.3.
11. What is the proposed height of the administration building, and poultry receiving hall? What are the dimensions of the main powerhouse and associated exhaust stack?
12. Provide a visibility analysis and photo-simulations of the proposed exhaust stack that includes projected impacts on the Schwartz Road neighborhood, Fitchville Historic District, and the Blue Hill Road and Brush Hill Road areas.
13. Has CRE initiated any contact with the Connecticut Commission on Culture and Tourism? If no, when does CRE intend to do so?
14. Provide a diagram that depicts the boundary of the Fitchville Historic District.



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
