

**PETITION FOR A DECLARATORY RULING
OF IROQUOIS GAS TRANSMISSION SYSTEM, L.P.**

Iroquois Gas Transmission System, L.P. (“Iroquois”) hereby petitions the Connecticut Siting Council (the “Council”) for a declaratory ruling that:

(i) Under the Natural Gas Act, 15 U.S.C. § 717 *et seq.*, and the Connecticut Public Utility Environmental Standards Act, Conn. Gen. Stat. § 16-50g *et seq.*, the Council has an advisory role to the Federal Energy Regulatory Commission (“FERC”) regarding the Connecticut portions of Iroquois’ 08/09 Expansion Project (the “Project”). The Project consists of: (a) a proposed natural gas compressor station in Brookfield Connecticut; (b) a new 36-inch outside diameter pipeline looping and associated aboveground facilities in Newtown, Connecticut; and (c) a new 20,620 horsepower compressor station in Milford, Connecticut, each as described in Iroquois’ May 24, 2007 filing with the Council.

(ii) In such advisory role, the Council may comment to the FERC as to whether such facilities, with such conditions as the Council may propose to FERC, would or would not have a significant adverse environmental impact.

Iroquois notes that this advisory role is precisely the same role as that taken by the Council in Petition No. 755A.
