

1. What were the results of Watertown Renewable Power, LLC's (WRP) notice to abutting property owners regarding its Petition (Petition) for a Declaratory Ruling that No Certificate is Required? Did WRP receive certified mail receipts from all abutters? If not, how many receipts were not returned? Did WRP make any additional attempts to notify property owners from whom it might not have received return receipts?
2. Provide the name of the property owner.
3. Would the power plant have black start capability?
4. Provide the status of the ISO New England Feasibility Study referenced in page 10 of the Petition. Provide a copy of the report if it is available.
5. Provide the status of WRP's application for an Inland Wetland Permit. Provide a copy of the permit if it is available.
6. Provide the status of the Electric and Magnetic Fields (EMF) report. Provide a copy of the report if it is available.
7. Calculate the amounts of cut and fill that would be required to develop this facility.
8. How many trees with a diameter greater than six inches at breast height would be removed during the development of the proposed power plant and access drive?
9. Would any blasting be required at the proposed site?
