





Seasonal Influenza Vaccine Recommendations

- persons aged ≥ 50 years;
- Children 6 months to 18 years
- pregnant during the influenza season;
- persons who have chronic medical conditions;
- persons who have immunosuppression;
- residents of long-term care facilities;
- health-care personnel direct patient care;
- household contacts and caregivers of children aged < 6 months; and
- household contacts and caregivers of persons with medical conditions that put them at higher risk for severe complications from influenza.



H1N1 VACCINE



- **Vaccine procured and purchased by US government**
- **Vaccine will be allocated across states proportional to population**
- **Vaccine will be sent to state-designated receiving sites: mix of local health departments and private settings**



MESSAGING

- **Monovalent seasonal influenza vaccine**



PRIORITY POPULATIONS

H1N1 VACCINE

Initial efforts should focus on vaccination of as many people as possible in initial target groups

- **Pregnant women**
- **Household and caregiver contacts of children younger than 6 months of age**
 - **Health care and emergency medical services personnel**
 - **Children from 6 months through 18 years**
- **Persons aged 19-24** because we have seen many cases of novel H1N1 influenza in these healthy young adults and they often live, work, and study in close proximity, and they are a frequently mobile population; a,
- **Persons aged 25 through 64 years who have medical conditions associated with higher risk conditions**



LIMITED VACCINE SUPPLY

- **Pregnant women**
- **Household and caregiver contacts of children younger than 6 months of age**
- **Health care and emergency medical services personnel with direct medical contact with patients or infectious materials**
- **Children 6 months through 4 years old**
- **Children with chronic medical conditions under 19 years of age**




