

Hello

My name is Dianne Jones and I am here on behalf of Mr. Guy Eugene. For many years I watched him as a teenager run around in the community. During this time I was unaware of Guy's life circumstances. I learned of Guy's background after he was sentenced to 45 years in jail for murder.

Guy reached out to me from jail. I learned that Guy lived in the basement of a house that I owned. That accounts for why I saw him in the community so much. He apologized for not telling me that he was a runaway and that he lived on my property. Guy shared his life story with me. He was born in Haiti and as a kid he lost his mom at the age of 9, she never made it to US to unit with Guy and his father.

Guy stated that he became very angry after his mom passed and his family couldn't afford to send him to Haiti to attend the funeral. He stated that he was viewed as a difficult child and was placed into foster care where he repeatedly ran around. On one of occasion Guy never returned to foster care and began a life of a repeat offender. He stated that at the time we met he was homeless, eating out of garbage cans, stealing, manipulating his way to living with different kids unknowingly to their parents.

When the shooting occurred I was not aware that Guy was the perpetrator. In fact, I was not around much for the trial because I had mixed emotions about their being so many shootings in my neighborhood. But, had I known that Guy was the child involved in the shooting I would advocated on his behalf because I felt he was a kid always reaching out.

At the age of 17 years old was found guilty in a triple shooting incidence where one person was left dead. This was a kid originally from New York with a family that speaks very little English. He lost his mom at age 9 yrs. of age and shortly after was placed into foster care in CT.

I have served as Guy's family for over ten years. His family speaks very little English and regrets not having much in put into helping Guy.
