

Veterans' Home Chapel Window Listing

All the windows in the new ecumenical chapel were donated by individuals or organizations and are safety-rated glass.

Some designs are based on an organization's emblem as modified for the size and medium, while others have extra meaning for the donors.

| HE-A | Blue Star Mothers, CT Chapter 3 | Variant of the Blue Star Mothers banner |
| HE-B | Navy Nurse Corps Sons of the Union Veterans of the Civil War, Alden-Skinner Camp #45 | Navy Nurse emblem, dedicated to Celine Finn |
| HE-C | War, Alden-Skinner Camp #45 | SUVCW members trace ancestry to Union soldiers of the Civil War. |
| HE-D | Disabled American Veterans Chapter 17 | The motto Forget Me Not was the inspiration for the details in this long, narrow window |
| HE-E | Vietnam Vets of America/ CT | Based on the Vietnam service ribbon and VVA emblem |
| HE-F | "Chaplains" | Peace dove against mosaic of earth, water, air, & sun. Donated by the parishioners and chaplains, this is the only window which faces outward to welcome people inside. All other windows face inwards, as thoughts turn inward inside a house of worship. |
| H1-A | WAVES Unit 42 CT Yankees | The gold-fouled anchor of the Women of the Sea Services |
| H1-B | DVA HR, M. Mancini | Three poppies donated by three ladies of the Human Resources Dept. The first window completed. |
| H1-C | Jewish War Veterans and their Auxiliary, CT | American eagle landing on a living tree limb; the broken branch remembers fallen comrades. |
| H2-A | M. Concannon | An Irish claddagh ring |
| H2-B | M. Pantoja | Flag/shield design in honor of family members |
| H2-C | Commisioner Schwartz | Thirty-two stars stand for the thirty-two family members and ancestors of the Spoonster & Schwartz families who served. The rose and olive branch symbolizing the donors flank a candle of remembrance. The quote is from the Ken Burns documentary "The War." |
| H3-A | FWW, Department of Connecticut | Men's Auxiliary emblem |
| H3-B | FWW, Department of Connecticut | Quote from Abraham Lincoln's second inaugural address, March 4, 1865 |
| H3-C | FWW, Department of Connecticut | Veterans of Foreign Wars & VFW Ladies Auxiliary emblems |
| C1-A | Connecticut Daughters of the American Revolution | General Washington praying at Valley Forge. Although modified for the medium, the details of the sword hilts, spurs, and hat cockade were confirmed with an expert on the American Revolution. |
| C1-B | Connecticut Daughters of the American Revolution | Parchment scroll reading We the People along with period spectacles, quill, and inkwell with lid |
| C2-A | American Legion, Dept of CT | AL, ALA emblems |
| C2-B | Sons of the American Legion, Dept of CT | SAL emblem |
| C3-A | Military Order of the Purple Heart, Chapter 1, Derby C | American flag above, Purple Heart medal below |
| C3-B | Wm Brennan Memorial | A Kiowa Warrior OH-58D helicopter against the sunset. |
| CE-A | VFW Post 9929/Levitow Memorial | Medal of Honor and ribbon, Air Force, in memory of recipient and Post 9929 member John Levitow |
| CE-B | Varano Memorial | Waving flag, small purple heart in upper right |
| CE-C | Edward Bakanas Memorial | All the Bakanas daughters have a suncatcher with this design made by their late father. |
| CE-D | Veterans Home Volunteers | Stars and stripes for the volunteers who donate so much to the Veterans' Home |
