



CANTERBURY, CT VETERANS' MEMORIAL

Canterbury's Memorial to its residents who have served our country during the time of war is located at 1 Municipal Drive, Canterbury, Connecticut, just to the right front of town hall.

From *"Canterbury: The First 300 Years,"* by Amy Orlomoski & A. Constance Sear, Arcadia Publishing: "In 1971, several groups in town joined together to dedicate a new veterans memorial to honor all Canterbury veterans from all wars. The stone monument replaced a wooden honor roll located in the vicinity of modern-day Lovell Lane which was deteriorating. Originally placed in front of the Baldwin School, the monument can be found near the town hall".

After many years of research and design, a small park-like setting with the addition of park benches and two additional granite stones were added to the memorial. These stones list, by name, each Canterbury wartime veteran. The new memorial park was re-dedicated in June of 2008. Addition of citizen soldiers to the memorial is conducted each July 4th, starting in 2009.
