

CANTON, CONNECTICUT VETERANS' MONUMENTS



On May 30, 1903 a monument was dedicated in the Village Cemetery to the soldiers of the War of the Revolution, War of 1812, War with Mexico, War of the Rebellion, and the War with Spain. Canton also marks graves of soldiers from the French and Indian Wars.

The monument lists the names of Canton soldiers who were buried in unmarked graves in the South.



In 1918 and 1943 a Roll of Honor stood next to the cannon at the corner of River Rd. and present-day Route 179.

On November 11, 2001 a monument was erected at that site in remembrance of Canton soldiers of World War I, World War II, The Korean War, and the Vietnam War.
