

## **GLASTONBURY, CT VETERANS MEMORIALS**

Glastonbury Monuments are located on the Glastonbury Green on Hubbard Street, accessed by Main Street (RT.17) or New London Turnpike. Also exit nine east bound on route two.



There are Seven granite monuments presently with three in process. Eight plaques total. Two small granites in Memory of Glastonbury high school graduate and veteran of Vietnam, John L. Levitow a Medal of Honor Recipient and Ronald R. Williams who died in the tragic sinking of the submarine USS Scorpion on June 05, 1968.

Four large Granite monuments with plaques depicting names of town residents who served or died during WWI, WWII, Korea, Vietnam.

There is one tall (approximately twenty feet) Civil War Monument with soldier on top. Dedicated in 1913 in memory of Captain Fredrick M. Barber of Manchester and the soldiers of Glastonbury who served in the Civil War.
