

MIDDLEFIELD, CT VETERANS' MEMORIALS



Town Green - Three plaques.

This memorial is located on Middlefield's town green adjacent to the Fire Department at the corner of Route 157 and Jackson Hill Road. There are three sections to the memorial with the names of local men who served in World War I, in world War II and Korea, and in the Vietnam War. A memorial service is held here each Memorial Day and each Veterans Day.



Memorial School

This memorial is called Memorial School, now the property of Regional School District #13. This school was dedicated in 1954 and rededicated in 2005 in honor of Middlefield's veterans. The plaque inside the school's main entrance reads - "Dedicated in honor of our Middlefield veterans who gave their lives for us and for our country and in honor of those from Middlefield who served their country in time of war and in time of peace".

Malcolm Memorial

This memorial is located in the Middlefield Community Center on Route 157 adjacent to the Middlefield Fire Department. The building is a recently renovated school which now houses some town offices, the Historical Society, the Middlefield Senior Center and community resource rooms. The plaque is located on the upper lever by the main entrance and is attributed to Sergeant John Malcolm, U.S. Army, a Middlefield resident who was killed in combat in Vietnam in 1970.
