

NEW MILFORD, CT VETERANS MEMORIALS



The "All War" monument (left) is on the south end of the New Milford Green and it honors all Veterans from all the wars past and present, with the individual branch of the service emblem engraved in it. This monument is where most of our ceremonies concerning Veterans take place.



The monument (right) is two sided. On the North side of the monument is listed all the Veterans from New Milford who served in "The Civil War" and on the South side of the monument you have listed all the Veterans from New Milford who served in World War I".



(left) At the North end of the green near the New Milford Historical Society, a bust of Abraham Lincoln's Head with four writings on this monument including President Lincoln's "Gettysburg Address".



In the center of the Village Green, a monument (right) dedicated in 1951 to Admiral Knapp, whose sisters had the ships bell from the USS Pittsburgh erected in his honor.


The New Milford Town Hall sets on the original site of the home of Roger Sherman who lived in New Milford and the only signer of all 4 critical documents creating the nation. Within the wall of the town hall is a "Roll of Honor", listing all the Veterans from New Milford who served during "World War II". There is also a plaque honoring the two New Milford Veteran's killed in "The Vietnam War" and the lone veteran of New Milford from the "Korean War" who is still listed as "Missing In Action" since 1951. On Veterans Day, November 11, 2010, there will be a 30" X 40" plaque dedicated and hung within the walls of the town hall honoring all New Milford Veterans who served during "The Korean War"



On the very South end of the village green, we have a flagpole. A plaque (left) at the base of this pole lists the names of the Veterans from New Milford who lost their life during "World War II". A World War II Stuart Tank rests on the village green, dedicated to World War II Veterans from New Milford.



The New Milford Public Library building was erected in 1898 and dedicated to the "Civil War Veterans" of New Milford. The second floor "Memorial Hall" is dedicated to the Upton Post of "The GAR" from New Milford.



The Town historic sign (right) depicts information of significance in New Milford and notes "Roger Sherman" who was a resident of New Milford.
