

NORTH HAVEN VETERANS MEMORIALS



The Civil War Memorial was dedicated in 1905. The Rodman Gun was brought to North Haven from the Coastal Defense at Fort Nathan Hale Park in New Haven and proudly rests on the historical Town Green.



The Town Hall of North Haven is known as Memorial Town Hall and was built as a Civil War Memorial in the 1987's. A Civil War plaque is mounted on the south wall of the foyer. (left)

On the north wall of the town hall there is a World War I bronze plaque. (right)

A steel gray stone monument on the front lawn of the Town Hall was erected in the 1980's as a simple tribute to those men and women who served their country in all wars.



The North Haven Historical Green is the site of a large granite memorial honoring veterans from World War II, Korea and Vietnam.

The bridge on Old Broadway has a Medal of Honor plaque (no photo) in remembrance of Fred Jackson, the only North Haven resident to receive such an honor. Jackson was a member of President Abraham Lincoln's Honor Guard when the President's body was transported from Washington, DC to Springfield, Illinois.
