

Vernon, Connecticut Veterans Memorials

Whitney T. Ferguson III Memorial

Located on Whitney T. Ferguson III Road, this memorial is dedicated to the memory of Whitney T. Ferguson III, a recipient of the Bronze Star for Valor, who was killed in action in Vietnam on March 11, 1969.



West Side Memorial

This memorial is located on Talcotville Road. The memorial is dedicated to the honor and memory of the men of the West Side of Vernon Rockville who served in World War II.



Central Park

Central Park, which is located directly in front of Town Hall, has memorials dedicated to the honor and memory of service men and women who served in world wars. There is a stone in memory of US Army CPL Albert Ellsworth Boothroyd, who gave his life in the Korean War; that same stone is dedicated to the honor of all those from Vernon who served in the United States Armed Forces. There is also a **Vietnam Veterans Memorial** stone, which honors all those who served, and lists the Vernon residents who were killed in action.



Town Hall

The Vernon Town Hall is called the Memorial Building. It is located on Park Place, overlooking Central Park. The first gathering in the town hall of the Memorial Building was held on Saturday, September 6, 1890. It is also the home of a Civil War Museum.





War Memorial Tower

The War Memorial Tower was dedicated in 1939. It is located in Henry Park, which is at 120 South Street. It stands as a memorial to the veterans of our wars.



Lafayette Memorial

This memorial is dedicated to General Lafayette. It is located on the corner of Hartford Turnpike and Mile Hill Road, in a location which was near the Old King Tavern, where he was received and entertained by a few remaining veterans of the Revolutionary War on September 4, 1824.
