VETERANS MEMORIAL VIETNAM MEMORIAL

Both memorials are located at the intersection of Nott Street and Hartford Avenue, Wethersfield. The first memorial (right) is in commemoration of the patriotism and valor of the Men and Women of Wethersfield who served their country and humanity in time of war. The first memorial was presented to the Town of Wethersfield in 1927 by Frederick W. Warner.



The second memorial (below) is to honor all those who served their country during the Vietnam Conflict.

VETERANS MEMORIALS



Located in Wethersfield Village Cemetery on Marsh Street. This memorial was erected in the 1970's in memory to those who died in Wethersfield preserving our country during WWI, WWII, Korean Conflict and the Vietnam Conflict.

Located at the Emerson Williams School on Welles Road this memorial is in honor of all who served and in memory of those of the Ridge Road District in Wethersfield who died in WWII so that others may live. The memorial was presented and dedicated May 30, 1947 by the Ridge Road District Improvement Association.

VETERANS MEMORIAL PLAQUES



Located at Town Hall on Silas Deane Highway this plaque is dedicated to all those who served their country in time of war and in memory of those Wethersfield residents who gave their lives during WWI, WWII, and the Korean Conflict. The plaque was presented in 1960 by the Wethersfield Veterans Association.
