


## WILTON, CT Veterans Memorials



#1 – WW II - A bronze memorial plaque with the names of WW II men and women who served was placed in the Town Hall lobby and dedicated on Memorial Day 1948. A plaque listing those who gave their lives was placed at Hillside Cemetery.

#2 – WWI – After the war, a wooden sign listing those who served was erected in the former triangle at the corner of Sharp Hill and Danbury Road. On July 4, 1966, there was dedication of this bronze plaque mounted on a rock (on town property) near the Piersall Building on River Road.

#3 – All Wars – A rock with plaque next to the gazebo on the Town Green honors Wilton men and women who served in all of the Nation's wars.

#4 – A plaque was placed at the entrance to the American Legion hall in memory of Leonard Harrison Bennett, who gave his life in the Korean War. Also, a plaque dedicated to eight Wilton men who lost their lives in the Vietnam War.

#5 – Vietnam – A Memorial Award (hanging in Wilton High School) is given each year to an outstanding senior student in honor of Lt. John G. Corr, who gave his life for his country on December 28, 1967 in Vietnam.

In addition, the Wilton High School football field was dedicated as Memorial Stadium in October 1968 in memory of the eight men who died in Vietnam. The Lt. John G. Coor Memorial Award Fund is currently planning the landscaping of a new garden at the Wilton High School Memorial Stadium and installing flagpoles for the eight who died in Vietnam and for Pfc. Nicholas Madaras, a Wilton High School graduate who gave his life in Iraq in 2006.
