The Connecticut Veterans' Home, founded in 1864, was the first home for Veterans in the country.

At the Sgt. John L. Levitow Health Care Center (HCC) in Rocky Hill, our team of dedicated professionals continues our mission to "Serve Those Who Served".

The HCC follows a rehabilitative model providing long-term care to Veterans with chronic, disabling conditions who require 24-hour assistance.

The HCC is licensed by the CT Department of Public Health, the Centers for Medicare and Medicaid (CMS), and recognized by the U.S. Department of Veterans' Affairs.



Impeccable Care

When you walk through the doors of the HCC, one immediately feels a sense of community, comfort, and camaraderie. The HCC stands apart from other 24-hour care centers with full time physicians and advanced practice registered nurses on staff. Residents also enjoy private and semi-private rooms with en suite bathroom.

Our highly trained staff is dedicated to providing compassionate care to meet the unique needs of Veterans, built on the foundation of integrity, honor, and respect.

We pride ourselves on fostering these qualities as we honor Veterans for their service and encourage the innate bond between them.

Memory Care Unit

A secure, safe, and structured social environment with dedicated programming for Veterans with Dementia, Alzheimer's disease, and other illnesses affecting cognition.

Respite Care Program

Caregivers of Veterans living in the community can have relief from their duties.

This short-term program provides inpatient stay for a maximum of 28 days per 12 month period at no cost.
