### Violation Severity Level

<b>Medium</b>	Family meeting by provider Increased provider contact Activity restriction	Meeting with Juvenile Justice Social Worker and Supervisor Increase frequency of parole contacts Increased house confinement Behavioral contract with Juvenile Justice Social worker Call ins to Juvenile Justice Social Worker Increased community service hours	Removal from community for continued treatment  <b>Note:</b> All levels may be combined with any of the lesser sanctions as applicable.
<b>High</b>	Meeting with Juvenile Justice Social Worker  House confinement with behavioral contract from provider  Call ins to provider	Juvenile Justice Social Worker visits for check in and Team Decision Making  Assessment or screening for risk factors  Restriction of drivers' license	Removal for secure placement  Recommendation for adult incarceration.  <b>Note:</b> All levels may be combined with any of the lesser sanctions as applicable.
