***Graduates of Foreign Pharmacy Schools
Applying for Licensure as a Pharmacist***

- INSTRUCTIONS -

*These instructions accompany license application form
CPPCI-01 "Application as a Pharmacy Intern" and
CPPCT-01 "Application for Licensure as a Pharmacist by Examination"*

The State of Connecticut requires you to obtain a passing score on several separate exams before you may apply for a pharmacy internship and subsequently, licensure as a pharmacist by examination. More specifically, you must pass:

1. the Foreign Pharmacy Graduate Equivalency Examination (FPGEE) **AND** the Test of English as a Foreign Language (TOEFL) and Test of Spoken English (TSE) **OR**
2. the Foreign Pharmacy Graduate Equivalency Examination (FPGEE) and the Test of Spoken English Internet-Based Test (TOEFL iBT).

The Connecticut Commission of Pharmacy **does not** administer these exams.

❖ **Taking the FPGEE Exam:**

To apply for the FPGEE Exam, you may either

2. obtain a registration package by completing an Internet-based request form available on NABP's home page at www.nabp.net.

❖ **Taking the TOEFL, TOEFL iBT and TSE Exams:**

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Once you obtain a passing score on either the FPGEE, TOEFL and TSE **OR** the FPGEE and TOEFL iBT, an appearance before the Commission of Pharmacy is necessary **prior** to application as a pharmacy intern. Please contact the Commission of Pharmacy at (860) 713-6070 to schedule an interview. At the interview, you will be required to submit documentation that you obtained passing scores on either the FPGEE, TOEFL and TSE **OR** the FPGEE and TOEFL iBT.

After appearing before the Commission of Pharmacy and being approved for a pharmacy internship, you should complete application form "**CPPCI-01- Application for Pharmacy Intern**" that may be obtained directly from the Commission of Pharmacy at the following address: Department of Consumer Protection, Commission of Pharmacy, 165 Capitol Avenue, Hartford, CT 06106 or online at www.ct.gov/dcp. Complete this application and return it to the Department of Consumer Protection License Services Division at the address noted on the application with a fee of \$30.00 in the form of a check or money order.

You cannot apply for licensure as a pharmacist by examination until you have proof of at least fifteen hundred hours of practical experience required of a pharmacy intern.

The State of Connecticut has contracted with the National Association of Boards of Pharmacy (**NABP**) to administer both of the following national pharmacy licensing exams:

- North American Pharmacist Licensure Examination, known as **NAPLEX**
- Multi-state Pharmacy Jurisprudence Examination known as **MPJE**

In order to obtain licensure by examination as a pharmacist in Connecticut, you are required to obtain a passing score on the national NAPLEX exam and the MPJE (Connecticut version) exam. These are computerized exams that are administered through the National Association of Boards of Pharmacy.

❖ **Taking the NABP Exams (NAPLEX/MPJE):**

To apply for the NAPLEX and MPJE exams, you should obtain the National Association of Boards of Pharmacy's **NAPLEX/MPJE Registration Bulletin and either the Internet-based registration form or Scantron registration form** for each exam.

- ❖ The NAPLEX/MPJE Registration Bulletin is available in a PDF format on the Association's Web site, www.nabp.net. A hard-copy version is no longer published.
- ❖ The Internet-based registration form and credit card payment fee process is available on the Association's Web site, www.nabp.net, and allows for rapid registration and convenience.
- ❖ Scantron registration forms are available directly from either NABP or the CT Commission of Pharmacy. Completed Scantron registration forms should be mailed with the appropriate fee (bank check or money order) to NABP, P.O. Box #1057, Park Ridge, IL 60068.

The fee for taking the NAPLEX exam is \$465.00 and the fee for the MPJE exam is \$185.00.

Once you are approved by NABP to take the NAPLEX/MPJE exam(s), you will receive an "**Authorization To Test**" that contains the following information:

- 01.) NAPLEX/MPJE Examination Dates
- 02.) Test Authorization Number
- 03.) Candidate Identification Number
- 04.) Expiration Date

Once you receive the "Authorization To Test", you may make an appointment at an appropriate testing center to complete the test(s).
