

Reinstatement Instructions for Broker Licenses - Expired March 31, 2014

- A real estate broker license may be reinstated provided a completed reinstatement form and all applicable fees are submitted **not later than two years after the date of expiration of the license.**
- Reinstatement of a broker's license will only be accepted if all applicable fees are paid to bring the license to the current year and required continuing education is complete. Any such reinstated license shall expire on the next succeeding March 31st.

Reinstatement Fees:

- A total reinstatement fee of **\$420.50** must accompany the completed reinstatement application. Checks or money orders should be made payable to "Treasurer, State of Connecticut."

Continuing Education:

- You must have completed your required Continuing Education Courses in accordance with Connecticut General Statutes, Section 20-319 to be eligible for reinstatement.

Reciprocal Licensees:


- Reciprocal licensees must include a copy of their current license from the reciprocal licensing authority.

Legal Entities:

- Please note, all corporations, limited liability companies, partnerships or limited partnerships must complete the Legal Entity Reinstatement Form available on our web site at www.ct.gov/dcp.

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Real Estate Broker Continuing Education Requirements for 2012 - 2014

In accordance with Connecticut General Statutes, Section 20-319, Continuing Education is due on even-numbered renewal years to be eligible for reinstatement.

Continuing Education Options:

- Complete 12-hours of Continuing Education courses at an approved school (online courses are available). The courses shall consist of the following:
 1. Three hours of “Connecticut Real Estate Law: Updated and Revisited” (mandatory course)
 2. Nine hours of real estate elective courses



- Pass the Connecticut Continuing Education Examination. To take the exam, contact PSI Examination Services at www.psiexams.com or 1-800-733-9267 to schedule an exam appointment.

If you passed the Connecticut Broker licensing examination between April 1, 2012 and March 31, 2014, you do not need to take continuing education courses for 2014. Your PSI Examination score reports will reflect the examination passing date.
