EXPLANATION OF DCP CAVU COMPUTER SYSTEM TERMS CONCERNING LIST OR ROSTER OF LICENSEES (IE: INACTIVE, PENDING, DENIED, EXPIRED APPLICATION)

Ms. Roberts provided the Board with the various definitions concerning applications reflecting their status (ie: Active, Inactive, Pending, Expired, and Denied). Ms. Roberts informed the Board that the category status is intended to provide the public as to whether or not a tradesman has an active or inactive license.

INTERPRETATION OF CT GENERAL STATUTES, SECTION 20-330 PROHIBITING THE INSTALLATION BY UNLICENSED ELEVATOR PERSONNEL OF ANY HOIST THAT WILL BE CARRYING PEOPLE FOR ANY PURPOSE, SIGNED BY DCP COMMISSIONER AND CT ATTORNEY GENERAL.

The Board sought legal advice from their legal counsel, Assistant Attorney General Raul Rodriguez concerning the requirement of an elevator license for hoists used to carry personnel, which was clarified by the Department of Consumer Protection and the Office of the Attorney General that CT General Statutes, Section 20-330 prohibits the installation by unlicensed elevator personnel of any hoist that will be carrying people for any purpose. There being no further business, the meeting adjourned at 11:13 a.m.
