

September

Framing Rough-in Inspections: Residential

This class will provide an overview of residential rough framing inspections and will cover inspections items associated with decay protection, wall construction, rafters, rafter ties, ceiling joists, floor joists, girders, headers and fastening schedules including cutting and notching of structural members. How to evaluate residential framing systems for code compliance will also be discussed. *Greg Grew, AIA, Grew Design Incorporated*

Current Code Issues and Frequently Asked Questions

Connecticut Amendments to the 2009 IRC

Fire Official Enforcement Review

This seminar will review the correct procedure for writing an abatement order for violation of the CT Fire Safety or Fire Prevention Code or a fire safety statute, or for a citation of the Fire Prevention Code. Attendees will be provided current forms, instruction on writing and samples of an administrative search warrant application; used when an entry for inspection is required by law, i.e. when there is denial of access for a yearly apartment occupancy inspection, prompting the need for a court order before entry. Current forms, instruction and samples will also be provided for arrest warrant applications for fire violations not corrected after due process of law. *Judith R. Dicine, Supervisory Assistant State's Attorney, DCJ, Office of the Chief State's Attorney, Housing Matters*

December

Building Official Enforcement Review

This seminar will review the correct procedure for writing an abatement order for violation of the CT State Building Code or a CT building safety statute. Attendees will be provided current forms, instruction on writing and samples of an administrative search warrant application; used when an entry for inspection is required by law, i.e. when there is denial of access for a statutorily required inspection, prompting the need for a court order before entry. Current forms, instruction and samples will also be provided for arrest warrant applications for building code violations not corrected after due process of law. *Judith R. Dicine, Supervisory Assistant State's Attorney, DCJ, Office of the Chief State's Attorney, Housing Matters*

Camp Niantic

At front gate, tell guard you are attending class at the Regional Training Institute (RTI). The RTI is approximately 500 feet past the guard booth on the right. Park in the lot in front of the building.
