S 2011 NEC Chapter 3 & 4 Introduction to Changes

E This seminar will provide an overview of the most important changes in Chapter 3 Wiring Methods and Materials and Chapter 4 Equipment for General Use of the new 2011 National Electrical Code portion of the State Building Code, noting key changes between the 2005, 2008 and 2011 editions. Special attention will be given to the following topics: wiring methods, conductors, conduits, tubing, auxiliary gutters, wireways, raceways, flexible cords and cables, fixture wires, switches, luminaires, lighting systems, appliances, space-heating, motors, motor circuits and controllers, air-conditioning and refrigerating equipment, generators, phase converters and capacitors. *Rick Massicott, Lead Instructor, NECA & IBEW Local 90 JATC*

Liquefied Petroleum Gas Properties & Potential Hazards

This seminar will review propane properties, incidents and regulations, and the dangers of non-compliant installations. O This seminar will review a set of plans designed in accordance with the 2009 International Residential Code with the State of Connecticut amendments. The review will include footings, foundations, framing, electrical, mechanical, plumbing, energy, etc. *Tim York, Building Official, Town of Colchester*

The Smorgasbord (A variety of topics impacting fire enforcement, safety, prevention and code)

This seminar will discuss current issues facing the Connecticut code enforcement community along with a discussion on the development of the 2014/2015 State Fire Safety, Fire Prevention and Building Codes. *Terry Brouwer, Supervisor, OSFM, DAS*

D Fire Official Enforcement Review

E This seminar will review the correct procedure for writing an abatement order for violation of the CT Fire Safety or Fire Prevention Code or a fire safety statute, or for a citation of the Fire Prevention Code. Attendees will be provided current forms, instruction on writing and samples of an administrative search warrant application; used when an entry for inspection is required by law, i.e. when there is denial of access for a yearly apartment occupancy inspection, prompting the need for a court order before entry. Current forms, instruction and samples will also be provided for arrest warrant applications for fire violations not corrected after due process of law. *Judith R. Dicine, Supervisory Assistant State's Attorney, DCJ, Office of the Chief State's Attorney, Housing Matters*

Getting Ready for the 2012 IMC
