The Statutes that were used previously to get to the hazmat and special hazardous standards will expire on January 1' 2015. The 2012 IECC: Changes and Tests

This seminar will cover the requirements of the 2012 International Energy Conservation Code (IECC) and will identify the significant changes from the 2009 IECC for both residential and nonresidential projects. The requirements for the envelope, mechanical, service water heating, power and lighting will all be covered. Construction document information with supporting material for permit application and submittals for project completion will also be discussed. There will be an emphasis on documentation (REScheck, COMcheck, other) for compliance verification. The seminar will also cover the blower door test and duct tightness test for residential projects and commissioning for commercial projects. **Please bring the 2009 IECC or 2012 IECC to class.** *Fred Wajcs, PE, Energy Code Consultant*

The Inspection Process

This seminar is the first in a series of in-depth looks at the routine, annual inspection process. The focus will be on life safety systems such as fire alarm, standpipe, and kitchen hood systems. Participants will explore the third-party inspection process as it relates to code enforcement, including inspection reports, over-sights in the process, report requirements and the fire inspector's role regarding life safety systems during inspections. The following questions will be among those answered during the class: Should the fire inspector test the system during the inspection? What qualifications and licenses are required for the third party inspector? What should the fire inspector look for in third party reports? *Michael Sinsigalli, Fire Marshal, City of West Hartford*

Parking Information

Blue Hills Fire Department

Park behind the building.

Camp Niantic

At front gate, tell guard you are attending class at the Regional Training Institute (RTI). The RTI is approximately 500 feet past the guard booth on the right. Park in the lot in front of the building.

Central Connecticut State University (CCSU)

Alumni Hall: Alumni Hall is in the Student Center building. Park in the Student Center Parking Lot.

Torp Theater: Torp Theater is in Davidson Hall (building with white dome) on Stanley Street. Park in the Welte Parking Garage.
