



Test Procedures

[General Information]

- To be admitted to the exam you must bring your acceptance letter and a photo ID (i.e. Driver's License).
- The exams are composed of Multiple-Choice and True/False questions.
- Fire Code Inspector Exam is open-book. Acceptable reference materials are listed below.
- The Fire Investigator exam is closed-book.
- You will be tested only on material pertinent to the license you are seeking.
- Laptop computers, tablets, smartphones, etc. are not permitted.
- Cell phones must be turned off and put away.
- There will be no scheduled breaks.
- Bottled water is allowed, food is not.
- You must earn a minimum overall score of 70% to pass the written exam.
