He is currently in private practice with Dr. Michael Powers in Glastonbury at the Center for Children with Special Needs, where he does consulting to school systems and evaluations and individual therapy. He is also currently running a number of long-term social skills groups for pre-teens, teens and adults.

Dr. Loomis currently sits on the Steering Committee for the new Adult CT Autism Spectrum Disorder Pilot Project. This committee helped to develop the Pilot Program, now being run in the Greater New Haven area. Dr. Loomis is also a member of the Bureau of Rehabilitation's ASD assessment team.

Merritt Pkwy North – Rte 15

From New Haven heading north, take exit 65 and make a slight left onto River Rd. Turn right onto Hall Ave/CT-150. Make a left on Washington St. Washington St will turn into No. Plains Industrial Road. Proceed to 101 No. Plains Industrial Rd, Harvest Park.
