SUBJECT: **Update to MDC Boil Water Notice**

The Metropolitan District (MDC) issued a press release indicating that the following towns no longer need to boil water: **East Hartford, Glastonbury, Portland, South Windsor, and Manchester**. Therefore, food service establishments in these towns no longer need to follow the interim measures outlined in EHS Circular Letter #2009-31. A copy of the MDC press release is attached.

Food establishments in **Bloomfield, Windsor, Hartford, West Hartford, and portions of East Granby and Windsor Locks** should still follow the interim measures.

Questions about the adequacy of specific filtration systems used by some food establishments should be directed to a technical person at MDC at 860-278-7850 x 3600. Factors to be considered include the type of filtering system, its indicated use, filter pore size, and maintenance.

The Connecticut Department of Public Health Drinking Water Section continues to work closely with MDC as they investigate the situation. Pending additional information this guidance may be upgraded or downgraded as the situation requires.
