HARTFORD, CT April, 2011 HARC, Inc., an organization serving people with intellectual and related disabilities will hold its 60th Anniversary Celebration at The Hartford, Tower Suite, 22nd Floor, on Thursday, April 28, 2011, from 5:30 – 8:00.

The event will be attended by friends and supporters of the organization, among them Mrs. Margaret V. Tedone, one of the original founders of the organization, Former Senator Billy Ciotto and Mrs. Ciotto, Deputy Commissioner of the Department of Developmental Services, Kathryn DuPree, Hartford Councilwoman rJo Winch and representatives from United Way of Central and Northeastern Connecticut and many of HARC's community partners such as Robinson & Cole; Lincoln Financial; Guy Carpenter and Company; Travelers; Hoffman Auto Group; Kainen, Escalera & McHale; US Trust and Zachs Family Foundation.

To be introduced by Catherine Gibbons Way at the event, is the formation of The 1951 Founders Society. Named in honor of HARC's founding families and the year in which the organization began, The Founders Society recognizes individuals and families who provide substantial support to the organization's mission to help people with intellectual disability and their families enjoy lives of quality, inclusion and dignity by providing support, education and advocacy.
