There are fewer financial supports for people with intellectual and developmental disabilities (ID/DD) and their families. Families and providers are being asked to do more with fewer resources. Despite the fiscal environment families still need to make plans and learn about alternatives to DDS housing supports.

Come hear from a panel of housing professionals including a developer, realtor and banker who will share tips to create independent housing for adults with ID/DD given the fiscal climate. Included in the panel will be a family member sharing their unique perspective navigating housing independent of DDS funding.

Together we will work to brainstorm real life housing solutions for people with ID/DD in Connecticut communities and learn how to advocate for more housing resources.
