“Family Centered Services for People with Developmental Disabilities”

PARC was formed fifty two years ago by a group of concerned parents of children with developmental disabilities. The group came together for mutual support and to develop services that were not available to assist such families. Throughout its history, PARC has worked to fill gaps that have existed within the social services network, providing daycare, healthy living activities, a school aged summer special needs camp and education in independent living skills.

A volunteer board of directors comprised of community members, family members, and a client representative guide PARC. PARC has an executive director as well as part time staff who assist in the weekly activities. Membership is open to all individuals with a developmental disability and their families and caregivers. Donations are suggested for some activities; however participation is not subject to an individual's ability to pay.
