Economically Distressed Municipalities - Created by the CT Department of Economic and Community Development for the year 2007 and listed on their website.

Environmental Justice Areas - Created by The Capitol Region Council of Governments, CRCOG has developed maps of target areas with low-income. Low-income areas include additional block groups that had at least 30% low-income population (household income 200% or below the Census poverty threshold, by family size) according to the 2000 Census.



Political Boundaries - From the Connecticut Town Boundaries layer published by the CT DEP, which is derived from 1:24,000-scale DLG Political Boundary information compiled by the USGS. Source map scale is 1:24,000.

Roads - From the Routes layer published by the CT DEP, which is derived from the Connecticut Street Network State Plane, TIGER/Line 2000 layer published by the University of Connecticut, Center for Geographic Information and Analysis using the TIGER/Line street data originally compiled by the U.S. Department of Commerce, U.S. Census Bureau, Geography Division. Source map scale is 1:100,000.

Hydrography - From the Named Waterbody layer published by the CT DEP, which is derived from 1:24,000-scale DLG Hydrography information compiled by the USGS. Source map scale is 1:24,000.
