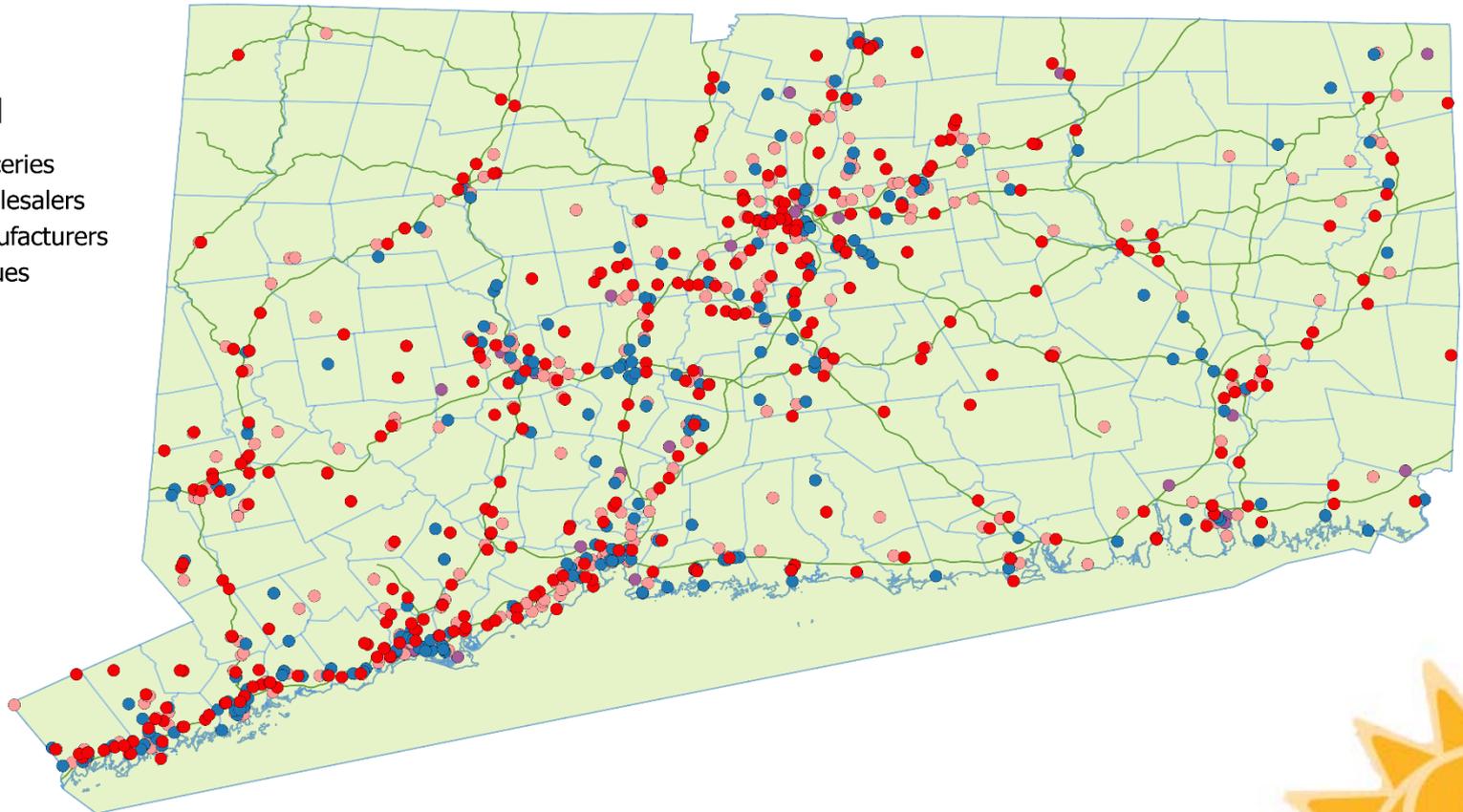

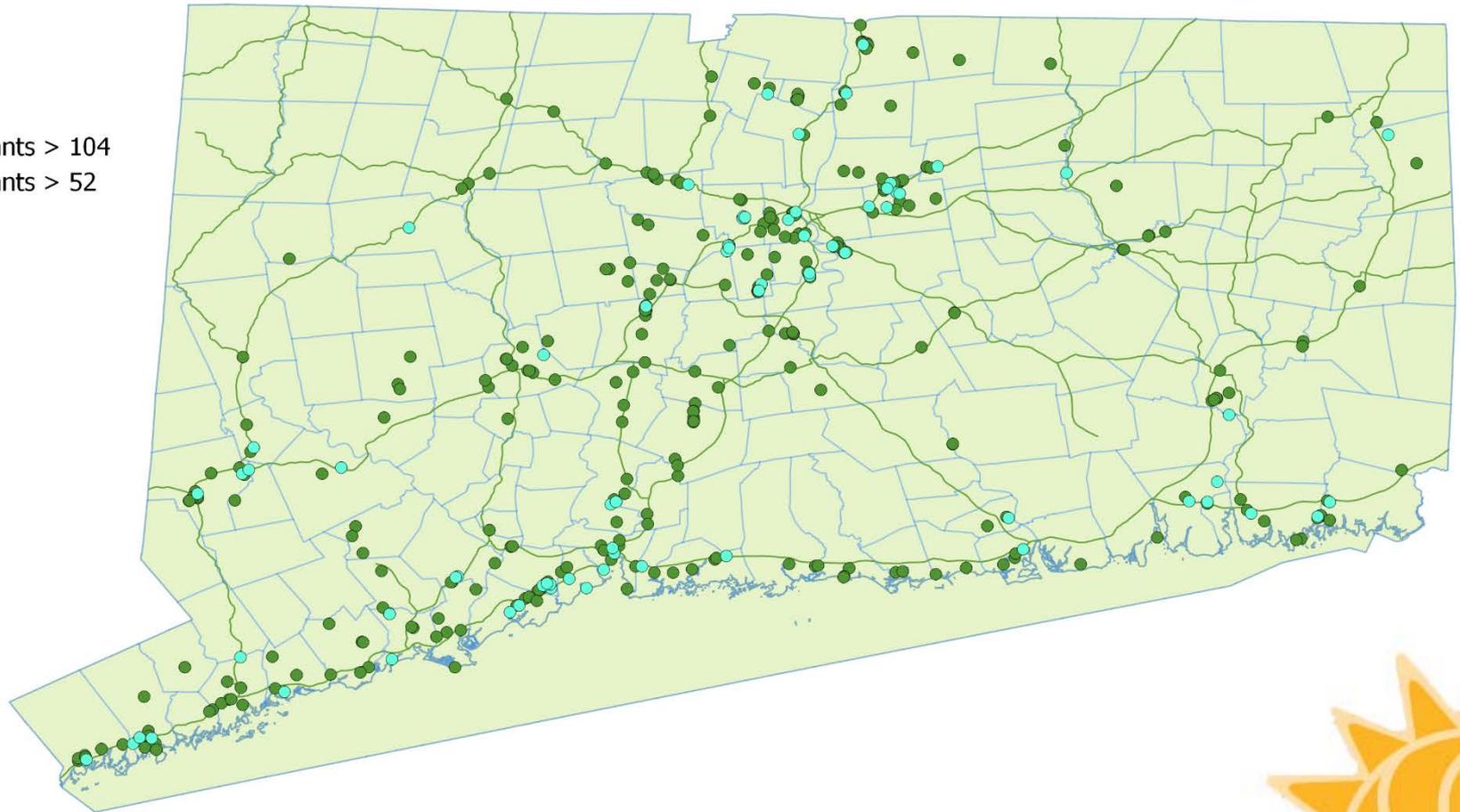

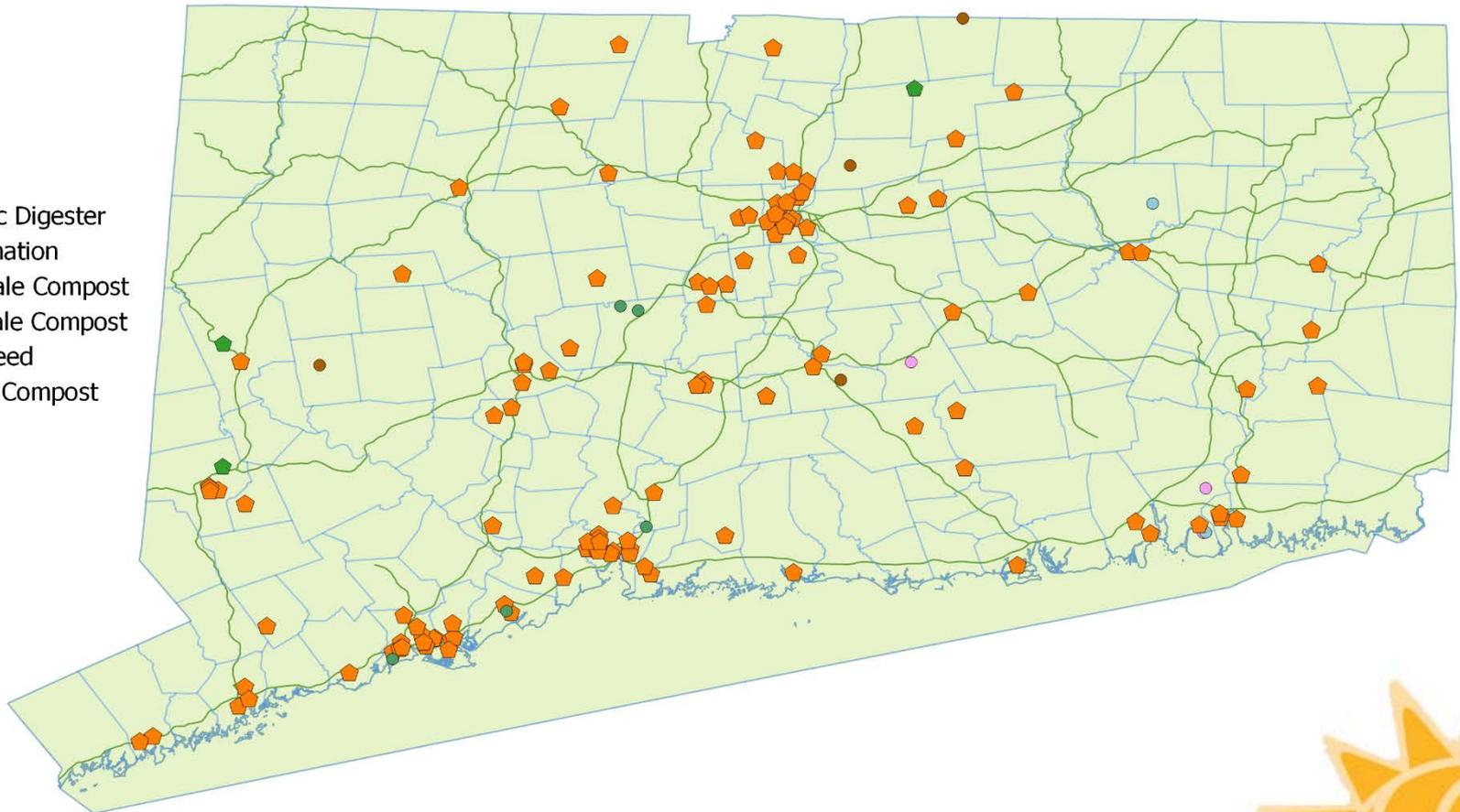

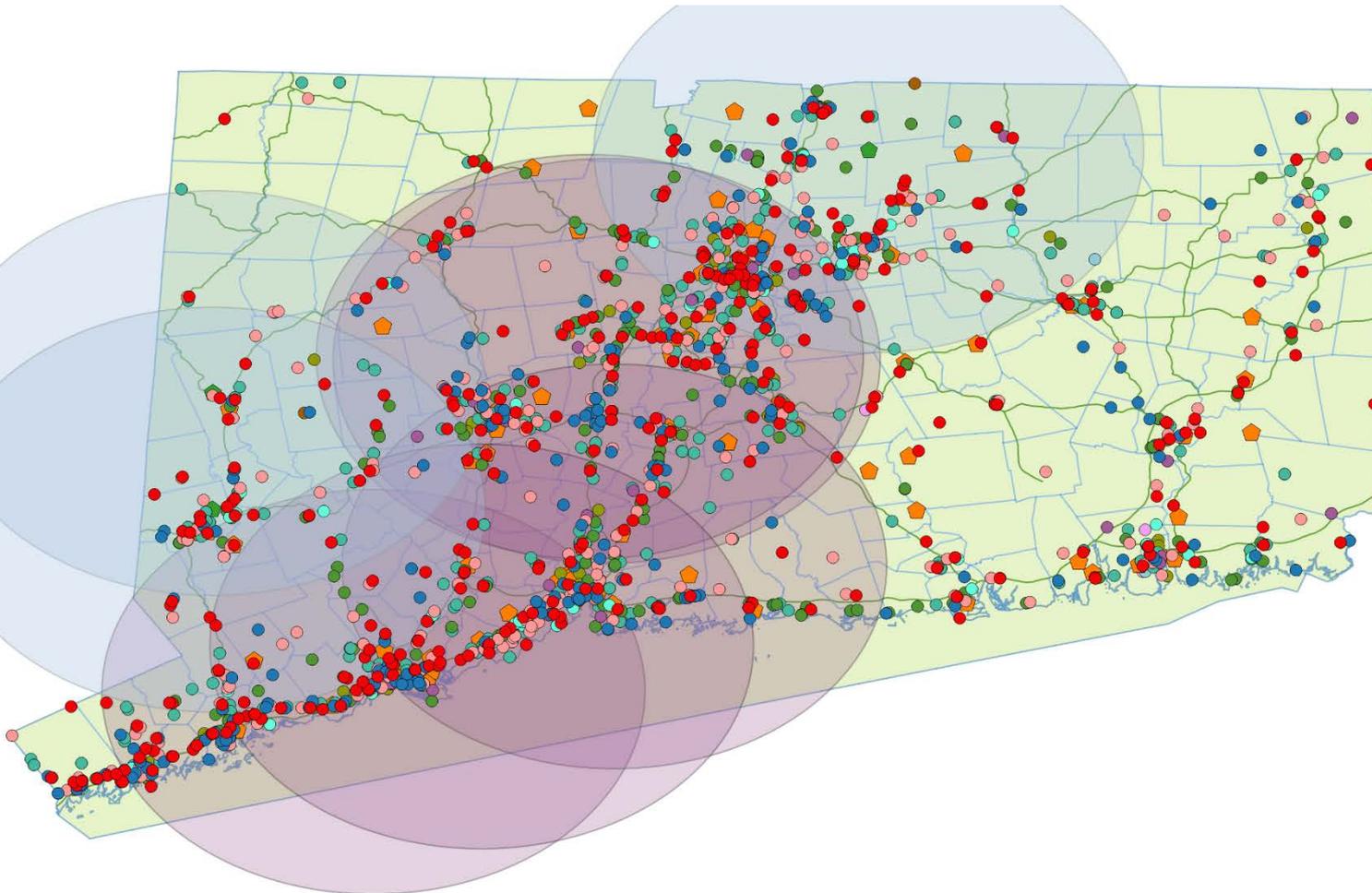
Food Donation & Organics Processors

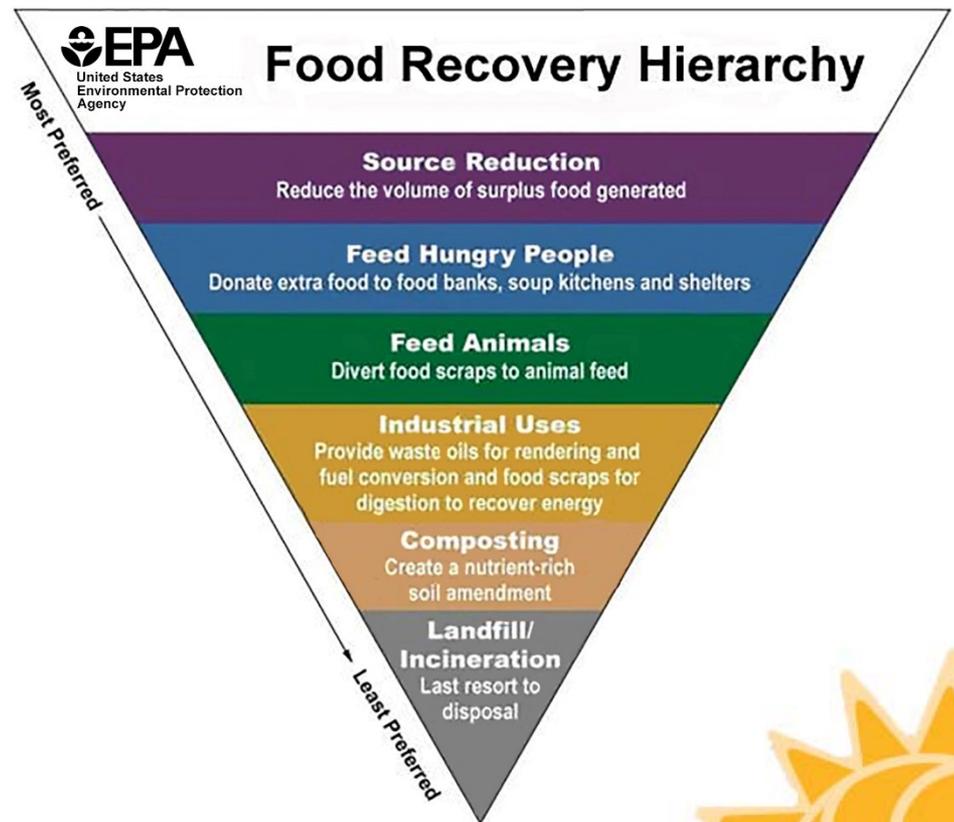
