Please follow the procedure required in previous cleanup order: do NOT give final DEEP permits until SEDRAP-permit work has been finished. We need to do this RIGHT and include Superior Plating cleanup while Mill River is disrupted. After decades already, don't rush the cleanup!

I attended the DEEP public meeting here and was both disappointed and disgusted by the time scheduling that left hardly any public-comment time. Who determines this kind of arrangement? DEEP officials seem so qualified and conscientious that I would not have expected such a Shut-the-Public-Out setup. DEEP explanation was far too long, and Exide had every reason to drag theirs out to shorten public-comment time. They should not have been permitted so much time for their cleanup explanation. Surely we shouldn't have to stay at extended meetings running until 11 PM (and you need to get home upstate and be able to have a decent night's sleep).
