



## WEATHER FORECAST

**STORM TRACK FORECAST...** A low pressure system is currently taking shape near the North Carolina Coast this evening. This low is forecast to intensify as it moves Northeastward overnight and passes approximately 150 Miles Southeast of Connecticut late Sunday Morning. A large shield of snow north of the Storm track will enter Southern New England later this evening and become heavy at times near the coast by daybreak on Sunday.

**For Southern Connecticut...** Some light snow and flurries may occur over the next few hours. Steady light snow is expected to develop along the coast between 10:00 PM – Midnight. The snow will remain light to occasionally moderate between midnight and 3:00 AM. The snow is then expected to become moderate across Southern CT and heavy along the coast and in Southeastern CT after 4:00 AM. The snow will continue heavy at times across the southern half of Connecticut between 6:00 AM and Noon Sunday Morning before tapering off to light snow Sunday afternoon and ending between 4:00 – 6:00 PM.

**For Northern Connecticut and the Northwest Hills...** Steady light snow is expected to develop in the Hartford Area between 11:00 PM and 1:00 AM. The snow is expected to remain light between midnight and 4:00 AM. The snow is then expected to become moderate across Northern CT after 5:00 AM. The snow will continue moderate to briefly heavy at times across Northern CT between 6:00 AM and Noon Sunday Morning before tapering off to light snow Sunday afternoon and ending between 4:00 – 6:00 PM. Total snow accumulations are forecast to range from 7 inches in the NW Hills up to 14 inches along the Southeast Coast. The next update will be issued by DEMHS at Midnight.
