



Pre-Disaster Mitigation FY2015 (PDM)



The Pre-Disaster Mitigation (PDM) program provides funds for projects which reduce the overall risk to population and structures from future hazard events, while also reducing the reliance on federal funding from future disasters.

Sub-Applications are due to the State via e-grants no later than 5 pm on August 5, 2015.

To apply to the Pre-Disaster Mitigation program go to:

The State will then access the application for review.

Per Federal guidelines, a maximum of 3 projects and 7 planning sub-applications can be submitted per State.

Cost Share Breakdown (Percentage of Federal/Non Federal Share) = 75/25

Paper or email sub-applications cannot be accepted.

Eligible Sub-Applicants:

- State and Local Governmental Agencies
- Indian Tribal Governments

Eligible Activities:

- Mitigation Planning
- Purchase and Installation of Generators for Critical Facilities

Federal Priorities:

1. Mitigation Plans
2. Non Flood-Related Projects
3. Flood-Related Projects

Project selection will be on a nationally competitive basis.

SUB-APPLICANTS MUST HAVE A FEMA-APPROVED MITIGATION PLAN BY AUGUST 5, 2015 TO BE ELIGIBLE TO APPLY FOR PROJECT FUNDING

Projects must be in compliance with DEMHS's Pending Flood Management Certification from CT DEEP.
