



Flood Mitigation Assistance FY2014 (FMA)



The Flood Mitigation Assistance (FMA) program provides funds for projects to reduce or eliminate risk of flood damage to buildings that are insured under the National Flood Insurance Program (NFIP) .

Sub-Applications are due to the State no later than 5 pm on June 13, 2014.
Paper or email sub-applications cannot be accepted.

All eligible Sub-applications will be ranked by the Connecticut Interagency Hazard Mitigation Committee before submittal to FEMA. Sub-applicants will be notified of the Committee's rank by July 31, 2014.

Decisions by the CT Interagency Hazard Mitigation Committee are not subject to appeal.

Eligible Sub-Applicants:

- State and Local Governmental Agencies
- Indian Tribal Governments

** Individual homeowners and businesses may not apply directly to the program, however, a community may apply on their behalf if the property is covered by a current NFIP policy.*

SUB-APPLICANTS MUST HAVE A FEMA-APPROVED MITIGATION PLAN BY JUNE 13, 2014 TO BE ELIGIBLE TO APPLY FOR PROJECT FUNDING

ELIGIBLE ACTIVITIES INCLUDE:

- Property acquisition and Structure Demolition
- Structure Elevation
- Dry Flood-proofing (Non-residential and Historic residential structures only)
- Minor Localized Flood Reduction Projects (that primarily benefit NFIP insured structures)
- Mitigation Re-construction

*** All elevations/re-construction/flood-proofing projects must be designed to ASCE 24-05**

FEDERAL PRIORITIES:

1. Mitigation of Severe Repetitive Loss Properties
2. Mitigation of Repetitive Loss Properties

All projects must be cost-effective using FEMA's Benefit Cost Analysis Software (Version 4.8 or 5.0)
