Winter Storm Update from DESPP / DEMHS...

STATUS OF THE STATE EMERGENCY OPERATIONS CENTER - ACTIVATED

Bands of Light Snow Winding Down in Eastern Connecticut...

At 5:00 PM radar showed the band of light snow starting to wind down in Eastern CT. Current temperatures are in the low to mid 20's across the state. Winds are gusting from the North at 15 - 25 MPH. Total snowfall currently ranges from 6" - 8" in far Western CT, 10" - 20" in Central CT up to 24" - 32" in parts of Eastern CT.

The current band of light snow in Eastern CT should begin to break up over the next few hours with some additional light accumulations of around an inch expected in Eastern CT. Total snowfall for this event is now forecast to range from 6" - 8" in far Western CT, 10" - 20" in Central CT and up to 24" - 33" in Eastern CT.

The Department of Emergency Services and Public Protection will continue to monitor this storm and will send out another update at 7:15 PM.




